## INTRODUCTION

In line with its objective, International Trade Centre in partnership with different stakeholders across sectors in The Gambia, implemented a series of activities throughout 2023. This summary highlights our projects and activities implemented during the year.

# **PROJECTS OVERVIEW**

### Youth Empowerment Project (YEP)

YEP, funded by the European Union, addresses the economic root causes of irregular migration by supporting youth employment and entrepreneurship. The project takes a market-led approach to improve the skills and employability of potential and returning migrants according to the demands of the job market and simultaneously creating employment opportunities along Gambian value chains.

## **United Nations Migration Multi-Partner Trust Fund Joint Programme**

The joint programme aims to mitigate migration challenges and improve the crossborder environment along the Senegambia bridge (in Jarra West and Upper Baddibou districts) by enhancing border posts to presituations empt of vulnerability, strengthening the capacity of border authorities, increasing awareness among women and youth of their rights, and strengthening livelihood skills and opportunities for women and youth

## Jobs, Skills and Finance (JSF) for Women and Youth

The "Jobs, Skills and Finance (JSF) for Women and Youth in The Gambia" Programme funded by the 11th European Development Fund is implemented by the United Nations Capital Development Fund (UNCDF) in collaboration with the International Trade Centre (ITC). The project has an overarching focus on promoting a green economy such as renewable energy, sustainable construction and eco-tourism.

# COVID-19 recovery through digitalisation and market access for women horticulture producers

The project aims to sustainably increase the income of women horticulture producers and processors in The Gambia, who were disproportionately affected by the socio-economic crisis triggered by COVID-19.

# PROJECTS OVERVIEW

### The Gambia: Localizing SDGs - Improving the livelihoods of vulnerable women and youth around the Senegambia Bridge

The project aims to strengthen the economic and social rights of vulnerable groups whose livelihoods have been affected by the Senegambia Bridge. The newly constructed bridge not only has the potential to transform trade in West Africa and contribute to integrating the region by connecting Mauritania with Senegal and Nigeria but has a much wider social and economic impact on the trans-Gambia road corridor. While there are clear benefits for the macro economy of reducing the transit time of overland traffic, the bridge also has an important socio-economic impact on the communities along the transport corridor.

### Strengthening the National Infrastructure for **Peace to Promote Social Cohesion**

The I4P project is a joint peacebuilding initiative being implemented by the International Trade Centre (ITC), UNDP and UNESCO with the overall goal of strengthening the national peacebuilding architecture of The Gambia to promote social cohesion. The 3-year project is funded by the United Nations Peacebuilding Fund.

#### **ITC SheTrades Initiative**

The SheTrades initiative is ITC's flagship women and trade programme. ITC SheTrades targets all stakeholders across the trade and business ecosystem to create the right conditions and capacities for every woman, everywhere, to realize their full economic potential. ITC SheTrades provides women entrepreneurs and with access producers to knowledge, resources, and networks, support policymakers on inclusive policy reforms, and leverage public and private partnerships to amplify the impact of our work.







# KEY ACTIVITIES ACROSS PROJECTS


### **Capacity Building:**



- Held a 2-day digital literacy training for 22 women entrepreneurs.
- Trained radio hosts on the rights and opportunities under ECOWAS and AFCFTA.
- Trained 30 women traders in agro-food processing
- Trained 30 entrepreneurs in digital literacy.
- Held a 3-day capacity-building training for sports administrators from Foni.
- Held a 5-day digital literacy and digitization training for 30 women cross-border traders operating along the TransGambia.
- Held a 3-day training in entrepreneurship, food safety and packaging for 30 small-scale traders from Foni.

## **Institutional Support:**

- Supported Gambia Women's Chamber of Commerce with office equipment
- Supported Gambia Youth Chamber of Commerce with office equipment
- Launched the Gender Information Management System
- Launched a business coaching framework a standardized tool designed to guide coaching sessions to support the growth of businesses.
- Supported the Gambia Labour Force Survey.
- Supported the Foni Agency for Rural Development (FARD) to hold a 3-day workshop in Bwiam to develop a constitution and strategic plan for the organization.
- Supported 5 peacebuilding organisations with office equipment to strengthen their operational capacity further helping them to scale up their peace-building initiatives.





# KEY ACTIVITIES ACROSS PROJECTS

#### **Market Access**

- Supported the participation of 18 women crossborder traders in the National Youth and Women's Agribusiness and Tourism Trade Fair 2023.
- Supported the participation of 20 SheTrades members in trade events.
- Launched the Jokkalante Market Platform to connect farmers, buyers, transporters, and other value chain actors to interact and build partnerships for transactions.
- Held networking event on Public Procurement for women-owned businesses.
- Held a two-day training of SheTrades entrepreneurs on Export Readiness and Canva.

### **Access to Finance:**

- Supported young people and women who have completed a poultry training program with birds, feeds, and drinkers.
- Handed over equipment to **21** women entrepreneurs in horticulture and fashion sectors.
- Handed over equipment to **14** women-led businesses in the fashion and horticulture sectors.
- Handed over equipment to 18 women and young people from NBR and LRR.
- Provided grant support to 20 women-led businesses
- Provided start-up support to 300 young Gambians
